

- 1) The title mah-i dünya means 'moon of the world'.
- 2) 'Alī Ulķī 77r/153. 1 = J. The title has the form $m\bar{a}fr\bar{u}$ in place of $m\bar{a}h\cdot i$. The piece is assigned not to arazbar but to acem.
- 111: 1-2 A G (), 3 AG, 6 A, 14 e.
- Ma 1: 6 gf(t), 10 cBd, 12 BdA, 14 cBd. Ma 1 and 2 are written as one cycle to be repeated, with prima/seconda volta variants: 1: 15-16 BdA G, 2: 15-16 d.
- M a 3: 9 d, 10 cBd, and similarly M a 4. 3 and 4 are written as one cycle to be repeated, with primalseconda volta variants. Repetition of M a in Cantemir's version is therefore questionable.
- M b 1: 3 d, 6 g, 10 Bd, 12 A, 14 cBd, 2: 6 g, 10 Bd, 12 A, 14-16 cBd BdA G.
- 1.4 are written as two cycles, with double bar, but without a repeat sign. 5: 9 d, 10 cBd, and similarly 6. 5 and 6 are written as one cycle to be repeated, with primalseconda volta variants. -7.
