

353 is separated from 352 by a few pages with confused pagination. That on which 353 is written has the number 3. It is followed only by 4, which presents a list of notational symbols adding further pitch levels to Cantemir's set in order to juxtapose it with the set of pitch symbols devised Safi al-Din.

In addition to the *kebir* of *devr-i kebir* the heading has a further *kebir*, presumably referring to the *vezn*. Cycle divisions are marked by I or  $\mapsto$ . In the absence of a *mūlāzime* it may be assumed that H1 functioned as a ritornello.

H2 a,b: there is no term or symbol to separate these, merely a gap.
