


Aksak is not used as a technical term by Canternir, but an aksak fahte is listed by Fonton which has exactly the same percussion sequence as the modern lenk (=aksak) fahte, and it is not inconceivable that this is the cycle that was employed here. The modern fahte has 20 time units, and lenk fahte 10, so that if the same relationship obtained in the seventeenth century aksak fahte should have consisted of 5 time units with the following pattern of percussions:



The first two cycles of H1 would accordingly become four, appearing as:





113: one may surmise that the repeat may only have been of 5-10.
